
Mr. Fosso is also instrumental in the FSD Project that was awarded to Judea Harvest Namibia in partnership with the UPH Namibia, the uplift Namibian communities.

As part of the FSD Project he started a research facility with the Rheinisch Project in Rehoboth to be able to publish Namibian horticulture statistics on Hortivar, an FAO database to keep international stake holders in touch.

The main purpose of the FSD project is to teach communities in Namibia to grow vegetables and to improve their food security and nutrition and also to generate some income.

In view of the above and given the general efforts of the government of the republic of Namibia to enhance food security enhance food security through low cost vegitunnel improving food security as expressed in Vision 2030, the NHT requests that the application of Mr. Fosso be considered favorably.
